LASCIC, Latin American Studies & Chicano-Iberian Culture Network in coordination with El Colegio de Jalisco, and the University of Guadalajara (CULagos & CUTonalá), calls to submit paper proposals for the Seminar, which is proposed as a space for the analysis of problems such as economic, educational, and health inequalities, among others; conflicts of power management and public policies; cultural, ethnic, religious, identity and gender diversity; mobility, migration and human rights processes; Chicano and Latinx cultures. This, through both conjunctural and historical approaches in geopolitical fields, integration trends with a south-globalist vision, underpinned by reflexivity, thereby implying that society structures and explains itself, in an effort so that knowledge and research findings serve to promote a fairer region.

Deadline for submissions: May 29, 2024

Communication of accepted proposals: One week after receiving proposal

Proposal requirements (individual):

- a) Abstract with the following elements:
- i. Title of the proposal.
- ii. Abstract of up to 500 words including objective, methodology used and most relevant findings.
- iii. Five keywords.
- iv. Five bibliographical references that frame the submission (not counted in the 500 words)
- b) Short Bio (one page) containing: authors, institutional affiliation, and Email, as well as awards and distinctions and latest publications.

In case of panels:

- a) Title of the panel.
- b) Abstract of no more than 500 words, indicating the objective of the panel and name of the coordinator.
- c) Data of each participant (brief bio), as well as the title and summary of no more than 300 words of each presentation.
- d) Panels include up to four presenters.
- e) If Panel is proposed by an academic network, corresponding data must be included.
